Class Rules

- Quality of plants will be judged.
- All plant material must be grown by the exhibitor for 3 months prior to the Fair except for Fresh Arrangements (see Rule 3, below).
- For Fresh Arrangements, use only fresh garden material obtained from your garden or gardens of friends or neighbours.
- Do not use potted plants or soil in Fresh Arrangements.
- For Fresh Arrangements, accessories are permitted, and suitability of container will count.
- Do not add accessories unless the Section calls for them.
- All hanging plants must be ready to hang up.
- Plants should be groomed – remove torn leaves, dead or yellow leaves, dying blooms, dust, dirt, etc.
- Plants with insects will not be judged.
- Please attach entry tags securely to each container. No tape please.

Cut Flowers from Your Garden

Helpful definitions from *Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards for Horticultural and Floral Design*, Pub. 34/2003

- Stem – A main plant structure which supports flowers, buds, leaves or fruit.
 - Spray – The terminal flowering growth of an herbaceous or woody plant carried on one stem. Ideally a Spray would show all forms (flowers in bloom, buds showing colour, green buds and leaves).
 - Bloom – An individual flower, one to a stem, no buds.
11. Asters, 3 stems, same variety. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **TERRY BURNS**.
 12. Cosmos, 3 blooms. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **LINDA & CRAIG CURRAN**.
 13. Dahlia, 1 bloom, 10 cm (4") and over in diameter. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **JANE & BOB DEJONG**
 14. Dahlia, 3 blooms, under 10 cm (4") in diameter. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **JANE & BOB DEJONG**.
 15. Ornamental Millet - 3 stems of Jade Princess or Purple Majesty for use in a tall arrangement with at least one leaf left on the stem. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **HELEN SMITH**.
 16. Gladiolus, large, florets over 9 cm (3.5 "), 1 spike, 1/3 open, 1/3 partially open, 1/3 no colour showing. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **LORETTE TAYLOR**.
 17. Sunflowers, 3 tall (at least 24 ") pollen-free at least 5" in diameter of any colour combination. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **HELEN SMITH**.
 18. Petunias, a bowlful of single and/or double blooms. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **LIS FALK in memory of JOHANNA POUNTNEY**

19. Rose, miniature, 1 spray. 1st - \$10.00. donated by **TERRY BURNS**.
20. Rose, 1 bloom fully open without foliage, floating in a clear bowl in water. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **HELEN BEIRNES**.
21. Snapdragons, 3 spikes, same variety, may be different colours. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **HELEN BEIRNES**.
22. Zinnias, small under 3½" in diameter, 3 blooms, same size & variety. 1st - \$10.00 donated by **MELISSA COUCH**
23. Bouquet of five (5) varieties of cut flowers not named in this Group. Flowers to be named. 1st. \$10.00 donated by **DANA & HOWARD RITTENHOUSE**.

Helpful definitions from *Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards for Horticultural and Floral Design*, Pub. 34/2003

- Design – A combination of fresh and/or dried plant materials and/or organic objects arranged to create an artistic unit. The designer uses the elements of design: space, line, form, colour, texture, and pattern in the accepted principles of art: balance, rhythm, proportion, scale, contrast, and dominance to interpret the theme and create a design of harmony and distinction.
- Foliage Design – Design with interest in foliage. Foliage is to predominate. Flowers and/or fruits may be present but are inconspicuous or of minor importance.
