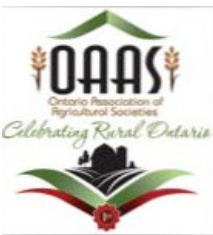

Class Rules

- Please read General Rules at the front of this Fair Book.
- All articles to be new and made by the exhibitor.
- Old, soiled or defaced work will not be judged.
- **Entries shown previously at the Chatsworth Fall Fair are not eligible for prizes.**
- **No straight pins please – only safety pins.**
- **All entry tags must show measurements where required.**
- Helpful hint: Home craft articles are best stored in fabric rather than plastic.
- New exhibitors should note on hidden portion of tickets that you **have not exhibited previously** in Homecraft Class 14.
- First prizes only awarded in Section 9 & 54.
- Prizes are as indicated. Specials take preference to the section

Hand Quilt and Machine Quilt Competitions

The following rules apply to **Sections 1-9** and are based on the OAAS website at <https://ontarioagsocieties.com/convention/district-and-provincial-competition-rules>



RULES: Please review the General Competition Rules Document for 2022

1. The quilt must be solely made, and hand or machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
2. Quilts to be measured on the perimeter.

Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular etc. All 4 sides must be measured to determine the perimeter measurement. For example, a square quilt that is at least 81" x 81" or a rectangle quilt that is at least 90" x 72"

3. The quilting must be through all 3 layers (top, batting and back) and not be mounted on a frame. The quilt may have a sleeve attached to the back for the purpose of hanging the quilt.

4. The winning OAAS Hand or Machine Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future OAAS fair, district and/or provincial competitions.
5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to give credit to the original designer of the quilt pattern based on copyright rules.
6. **For Machine Quilted Quilts** the use of domestic, mid arm, and/or long arm equipment is permitted on hand or computer guided machine quilt entries.
